# RECIPES FOR EXTRAORDINARY SPACES

Over recent years, interiors have come to play an increasingly important role in the world in which we live. In fact, interior design should be viewed these days from a different perspective. Interior spaces are to be conceived as constructed substances, whose penetration no longer means entering into an empty space, but being part of a complex body. Interior design embeds itself in history, nestling in the interstices between objects, creating situations. In addition to being shaped in accordance with their function, interior spaces reflect the needs of aesthetic representation, of visual communication and of evolving dynamic cultural requirements. The organisation of interior spaces speaks volumes, revealing their reason for being through a complex system of shapes, atmospheres, references and symbols.

## **PROJECT BRIEF**

That's right, Milan's Expo experience, addressing the theme "Feeding the planet", Energy for life" from various points of view, has just drawn to a close. This experience, however, does not represent a point of arrival, but a starting point for a new international collective way of thinking in relation to environmental, ethical and symbolic complexities underlying food production, trade, processing and consumption. The competition regards the design of an Interior space devoted entirely to a specific food or an individual recipe. Participants are required initially to identify and describe a food or a recipe or a particular preparation of food belonging to their own tradition and culture or quite simply of their own personal taste. The design project should define a public space, either a temporary or permanent space, which is to be organised around the staging of a chosen theme. This may include a concept restaurant, concept store, food stall, banquet, culinary school, communal kitchen, exhibition hall, theatre set, etc., or a hybrid and innovative solution from a functional point of view. The design should be set within a cubic-shaped volume, between 2x2x2m and 10x10x10m in size, which can be subdivided either horizontally or vertically according to preference and which may even be partially or completely underground. Participants will be asked to attempt to represent the multi-sensory, symbolic and ritual dimension of the relationship between man and food either in the space or through the space.

### **AUDIENCE**

The competition is open to young designers coming from architecture, interior design, and engineering faculties or professionals willing to explore the boundaries and constraints of the world of interior design, acquiring and widening their knowledge, critical awareness, original thinking.

#### **DELIVERABLES**

Competition participants are expected to submit no more than three **A3 sketches** and a **short text** written in English. The materials are to be provided in a digital format (pdf file, max 10 Mb). Entrants are free to chose the scale of reference for their designs, but should specify what scale has been used. When illustrating designs, particular importance should be given to the visual and scenic representation of the interior space (3d models, perspective views and sections, rendering, etc.).

Candidates are also required to submit:

- Personal portfolio of works and projects: (maximum 15 candidate's best interior design projects)
- Detailed curriculum vitae
- Motivation statement
- Copy of Degree Certificate
- Academic Transcripts
- NABA Master Programs Application Form Academic Year 2016/2017\*

Candidates are asked to send their materials in English language and in two files in PDF format: one including competition project and one including the remaining materials.

\* Application fee is waived for competition participants

#### JURY

Projects will be evaluated and selected by the Faculty of the Two-year MA in Design - Interior Design.

#### PRIZES


The six best projects will be awarded a scholarship for partial coverage of the tuition fee to attend the first year of the MA in Design - Interior Design starting in October 2016.

• 1st prize: nr. 2 scholarships covering **60%** of the tuition fee to attend the first year of the MA Program (1 for the English language track; 1 for the Italian language track)

• 2nd prize: nr. 2 scholarships covering **50%** of the tuition fee to attend the first year of the MA Program (1 for the English language track; 1 for the Italian language track)

• 3rd prize: nr. 2 scholarships covering **40%** of the tuition fee to attend the first year of the MA Program (1 for the English language track; 1 for the Italian language track)

The Academic faculty will also have the possibility to award 4 special mentions (2 for the English language track; 2 for the Ita-



English language track; 2 for the Italian language track) covering 20% of the tuition fee to attend the first year of the MA Program. Scholarships can be extended to the second year of the program, as long as the students meet the required standards, namely 27/30 average of marks and a total of **40 credits** of passed exams in the

fall session of the academic year 2016/17.

Candidates holding a first-level academic diploma or BA degree, or about to graduate within the academic

year 2015/16 and with a knowledge of the Italian/English language (according to the medium of instruction of the program) equal to a B1 Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

- NABA is entitled not to award the scholarship if the projects are deemed not to meet the suitable standards defined by the jury. The jury will judge at its own discretion and its decision is final.

- The scholarship will be deducted from the balance of the tuition fee.
- The assigned scholarship which will not be confirmed could be transferred to the next candidate in the ranking list.
